In August 2007, I participated in a statewide teleconference "town hall meeting" initiated by Congress man Dean Heller's Washington, DC. Congress man Heller addressed many issues important to Nevadans at that time, stating his position on various issues such as illegal immigration and the war in Iraq. He invited all participants to visit his Web site and e-mail him if he could be of any further service.
